



Nowhere Fast Biography

The Suffolk based indie rock band, Nowhere Fast formed in 2024 and quickly established themselves with a growing following by playing small venues like The Smokehouse in Ipswich.

This early success led the band to build their catalogue of songs with self written gems like Fever Dream, their debut single which was released on 31st July 2026.

Nowhere Fast are a five piece band who all live across Suffolk. Ewan Ramsey (Rhythm Guitar), Lewis Moore (Lead Vocals), Mackenzie Bacon (Drums), Ryan Clements (Lead Guitar) and Lyncon Watson (Bass Guitar) met at Suffolk One College in Ipswich and through mutual friends. They quickly started practicing together and formed the band.

Rehearsals for their first live shows started in 2024 with a set which featured covers of songs from bands like The Smiths, Joy Division and anchored by a couple of their own songs.

Lewis Moore

Lewis Moore (20) is the Lead Singer and is based in Suffolk and attended Suffolk One College where he met some of the band and started to develop his song writing skills.

Lewis started writing songs at the age of twelve and developed a wide range of musical influences from bands like Joy Division, The Smiths, The Cure and Oasis. Lewis also helps with the design of the bands posters and sleeve artwork and their social media output and marketing.

Ewan Ramsey

Ewan Ramsey (20) plays Rhythm Guitar and started playing at 16 when he was listening to bands like Oasis and The Smiths that he really loved. With his love for music starting during lockdown in 2020 when he had time on his hands, Ewan discovered the depth of indie music.

He had always had music played in the family home with bands like The Cure, The Stone Roses and even The Beatles and with a Dad who was a DJ in the 1990's, when lockdown arrived he really started to pay attention and learn to play the guitar.

Ryan Clements

Ryan Clements (20) plays Lead Guitar which he started playing at the age of 9 and was self taught at home. Inspired by his Dad playing, Ryan always had music and instruments around him growing up at home. His Uncle also played and had helped him with giving old equipment for Ryan to practice on.

Coming from a musical background, and growing up with a family that loved listening to music, Ryan's influences were the same bands as his dad loved. King Krule and Puma Blue add a jazzy and ambient element to the band, helping to create a more unique sound.

Lyncon Watson

Lyncon Watson (18) plays Bass Guitar with the band. He says the reason he got into music was listening to his friend Ted Stockdale, playing in the Playstation party chat and was jealous of his ability. Lyncon was lent a guitar and a bass by Ted's cousin Luke Durrant who came from a musical family, so that he could start to learn.

What inspired Lyncon to join a band was his change in musical tastes and listening to bands like The Arctic Monkeys, The Smiths and Oasis. These heavily guitar led bands inspired Lyncon to learn with his friends.

Mackenzie Bacon

Mackenzie Bacon (19) plays drums with the band. He can't remember a time when he wasn't fascinated by drums. Growing up in an incredibly musical family, with his Dad being a drummer, his love for music grew from an early age. Over the years, Mackenzie progressed from playing on pillows in front of the TV, to gigging regularly around the country.

Being brought up in a musical family led Mackenzie to develop a very broad musical taste and a vast range of musical influences. These influences span from Jeff Porcaro of Toto, II from Sleep Token and Busted's Eddy Throver. He also spent lots of time being taught by and watching his Dad play, another significant influence.
